Bill B. of the **Wonderful Saturday Step Group** shares his experience with Step Two.

Step Two- Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.

When I first read this, I couldn't see how any of this could possibly help me. I was raised in a traditional organized religion and then followed that up later on with more spiritual churches. So, when I saw the words "power greater than...", I thought how inferior your knowledge of God was that you could not even refer to Him as such in this step. How holier-than-thou and egotistical that same thought appears to me now. I also felt that I just wanted to be restored to "sobriety"- there was nothing wrong with my "sanity". So I just felt I would "play along"- as long as it stopped me from drinking.

Through numerous failed attempts at sobriety, doing it my way, both in and out of the rooms, Step Two had to take on an entirely different meaning for me. I realized that I had to abandon my pre- conceived notions and work this step the right way. I learned that my insanity was that even though I went through problem after problem with alcohol, I continued to think that I could drink safely and normally—that somehow, some way

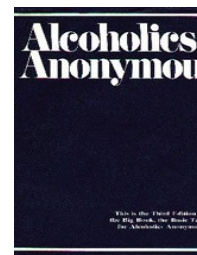

THIS time will be different. I was very forgiving of myself for my past deeds- all the remorse gone and it seemed like drinking again would be okay. I tried to beat this on my own and I came to realize that God-yes a power greater than myself was necessary to do so. I realized that I had to channel this higher power rather than just believing that one existed.

Also- that no other human power could relieve my alcoholic mind. No wife, no friend, no brother, child or parent could do this, nor could I stop drinking for their well-being.

It happened in following the guidance from the principles and people of AA.. I would have never thought I could learn anything about God from the people in the rooms ... and yet it happens every meeting.
